

Tito Valdez's early dance career with partners like Josephine Baker and Mae Murray. Discover Ruben's early family life and Puerto Rican heritage and how he broke away from his mothfamily life and Puerto Rican heritage and how he broke away from his mother's vision of his going to Columbia University to study medicine. Europe, both Spain and Paris, play a big part in his artistic adventures. Corinne's life and upbringing, so very different than Ruben's, is shared giving insight into her life struggles. Get to know Ruben and Corinne's families, and be swept away as you read the unfolding story of their many passions and loves. With provocative, electricying dancing on the nightclub circuit of the 1940s, Corrine and Tito Valdez delighted audiences coast to coast. Tito, born Ruben

Ruben was one of the original founders of the Arts Council in 1975 and became President in August 1979. Ruben was an active member in the burgeoning Greene County Arts community and taught in local schools, but how did he find Greene County and when was "Mr. Edison rich enough"? (It's in the book!)

Francesca Garcia Pratten lives in Port St. Lucie, Florida with her charming husband, Joe. Together they raised four children on a small farm in Leeds, New York. In 2015, using her father's notes and family oral history, she completed this story that her father started writing in 1972.

Two Lives, Many Dances is available for purchase at \$19.95. Published in a 8.5 x 11 inch soft cover format, Two Lives, Many Dances is perfect for any collector and a wonderful read. The 214 pages include graceful photography as evocative and beautiful as Ruben and Corrine.

In the 1930s and 40s, and even into the 50s and beyond, Schoenbergs's 12-tone theories were dominant. Academic tastemakers insisted that music must move beyond tonality. The rest of the composers or this PKO program rehalful composers on this BKO program rebelled (how American!) or ignored it. They explored many styles, most of them tonal, and borrowed from everywhere. The German-American Lukas

1922-2009, wrote his "Capriccio Foss for cello in a Neo-Classical vein even though that style had gone out of fashion. It is jam-packed with rollicking humor. William Bolcom, b.1937, wrote a Violin Sonata dedicated to the blues violinist Joe Venuti. Bolcom throws in some atonal music just for fun, nicely setting off the blues. The Swiss-American Ernest Bloch, 1890 – 1959, taps his Jewish heritage in "Three Nocturnes" for piano trio. The Polish-American Robert Muczynski, The Polish-American Robert Muczynski, 1929 - 2010, uses elements of jazz and primitive dance to enliven his trio. Mark O'Connor, b.1961, winner of many fiddle and guitar championships, takes us for a wild bluegrass ride in "Tennessee Two."

Lera Auerbach, a Jew from Siberia, defected in 1991 and walked 100 blocks daily to study at the Manhattan School of Music because she couldn't afford the subway fare Her "Duo for Violin and

the subway fare. Her "Duo for Violin and Cello: 3 Dances in the Old Style" explores the style of Baroque dances with modern the style of Baroque dances with modern string playing techniques and colors. And in a nod to past BKO themes-African-American and women composers-we will play music for violin and plano by Irene Britton Smith, an African-American woman, written in a Neo-Classical style, with a deft use of mischievous counterpoint. use of mischievous counterpoint

Finally, we have John Craig Cooper, who studied in Paris with Nadia Boulanger, and followed the advice "write in your own voice" she gave to her many American students. He has done so with a fusion of classical, jazz, blues, evangelical, and Eastern (he taught in India) styles. His "3 Meditations" finish with a "Hymn of Peace," which is a musical blessing this fractured

Great news! Many of you may have received our email earlier in July. For those of you who didn't and have been following our notices, here is the news.

The Greene County Council on the Arts and all Decentralization regrant organizations throughout the state have been spared the agony of facing a six month gap in funding beginning July 1, 2017. As I noted in my page 2 articles "Prompt Contracting Issues and Potential Budget Gap Problems" in the Mar-April and July-Aug issues of Arts Alive, this delay in contracts and funding would have necessitated furloughing/laying off our Decentralization staff since we could not operate the state's program without a contract. Naturally, this would have affected hundreds

sitated furloughing/laying off our Decentralization staff since we could not operate the state's program without a contract. Naturally, this would have affected hundreds of thousands of artists and community agency grantees and an untold number of their audiences, our constituents and your friends. Our General Operating Support would also have been delayed by six months and the risks of surviving without adequate funding loomed large.

So after 40 years of service to our communities, we are thrilled and relieved to tell you we should be around for another 40 years! Help from our elected officials, persistent advocacy through our coalition ArtsNYS and all your efforts on our behalf, certainly paid off. The New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) has worked out a solution, allowing us to receive contracts and funding in our fiscal year, July through June, rather than moving us to a January through December contract year.

We are extremely grateful to our partners at NYSCA for their willingness to hear our concerns and offer a solution which will work for all of us. Colorfully scored for pairs of English horns and French horns, this relatively brief masterpiece is a perfect example of the composer's spirited orchestral writing.



Over 190 fashion enthusiasts were in attendance! The fashion show featured a runway performance of all thirty designers' work, as well as trunk sales by high-end fashion stores Kasuri, Look Hudson, Brooklyn Industries, Laloon, and Artists and Revolutionaries, along with a silent auction for shopping sprees with co-curator and featured designer Jojo Americo, and makeover consultations with Face Stockholm. Paul Alexander of dance group The Ones was the MC at the event announcing the MC at the event announcing the models and designers on the runway. Michael DeBenedictus and Sam Aldi, Doubles II, provided the fabulously stocked and well tended cash bar. Both the Wearable Arts exhibit and fashion show are co-curated by fashion show are co-curated by fashion icons Michele Saunders and Jojo Americo. The Wearable Arts exhibit remains on display through September 17th at the GCCA Catskill Gallery located at 398 Main Street in Catskill, NY. While the Catskill High School puts on an annual fashion

show by its students, the GCCA Wearable Arts Fashion Show

marked the village's first professional fashion show, one lead by co-curator and featured artist Jojo Americo. Having worked for jewelry designer Glen Yank, and then for 17 years as the designer for Patricia Field's windows (before Sex and The City and The Davil Wasser Prad). America The Devil Wears Prada), Americo went on to create his own clothes, shoes and jewelry (he is the creative director of 1919-Jewelry For Happy People), in addition to painting, collecting, and being a

singing, songwriting member of dance music group The Ones. Americo is joined in the Wearable Arts exhibit by twenty-nine other designers Wearable Arts exhibit by twenty-nine other designers representing a broad spectrum of men's, women's and unisex clothing, jewelry and accessories. Designs range in fabrics and construction, from Kate Hamilton's wood and 'silk' burlap jacket (made with silken burlap, shipples tree wrap stables and shingles, tree wrap, staples and thread) to Laloon's painted silk dresses, Brian Kenny's collage iersey banners, and Ruby Silvious

jersey banners, and Ruby Silvious' teabag kimono, made of a little over 400 teabags.

Designers also represent a wide variety of professional experiences and styles. Jose Chardiet, a recent graduate of the Studio Arts program at Bard the Studio Arts program at Bard College who makes denim pants made from two distinct pairs of carpenter jeans, deconstructed and attached with zippers so that they can be flipped upside-down and worn in two

directions, is just beginning his professional designer career; professional designer career; while Chris Barreto, a Brazilian multimedia artist based in New York City, has had her vibrant hand-painted dresses exhibited at the Guggenheim Museum and The American Museum of Natural History, featured in Vogue Italia, Vogue Japan and The Village Voice, and worn by multiple celebrities, including singer MADONNA.

"The show we put together is all about items and object made by human hands and machines, color and cross-cultures with a firm grip on the here and now, current and futuristic moods," says co-curator Jojo Americo. says co-curator Jojo Americo. "The designers' works may vary in style, but still each artist is super passionate about their designs. This show is really a celebration of creation."

Co-curator Michele Saunders, a 'street casting' expert and form-er representative for the world's er representative for the world's most innovative fashion and art photographers, including Art Kane, Steve Hiett and Uwe Ommer, agrees. "Jojo and I were very impressed with the variety of styles in the submissions," Saunders says. "We went for designers that were innovative, and at the same time had a copped." designers that were innovative, and at the same time had a sense of humor. All the designers have great style and the quality of the work is impeccable, from fabulous linens and great cuts, to funky, urban hand-made designs. What they all have in common is that they are very now."


